- Challenges/Opportunities
 - Not much can be done about zebra mussels for now but watching U of M Research (Aquatic Thrusters may be helpful.)
 - Lack of Funds-SRCL is committed to not taxing shoreland owners. We depend on memberships and gambling proceeds from Shady's Long Shots.
 - Shoreland Owners can help...
 - 1. Don't fertilize lawns.
 - 2. Mulch grass when you mow don't bag.
 - 3. Keep leaves and grass out of lake.
 - 4. Aerate lawns.
 - 5. Install berms, breaks, and buffer zones on your lakeshore.
 - 6. Don't install used docks, lifts, rafts, or other equipment until after 3 weeks of sitting on land. It's a state law.

- o 2019, electroshocking YOY (young of year) walleyes at a rate of 120-130 per hour.

- Quality Bluegill Initiative statewide effort by fisheries managers to increase the size of Bluegills.
 - o Proposed 5 Bluegills/day and 10 Bluegills/in possession.
 - DNR will be conducting public meetings to discuss the initiative the dates and times will be posted.
- No Wake Zones
 - o The Stearns County Sheriff will be conducting a survey between Memorial Day and Labor Day to determine whether or not No Wake Zones will be added to the Chain of Lakes in three proposed locations.
